ECSA Range Rules

June 2012

Administrative Rules

Access: Certified Range Officers will control gate access. All members and guests must sign the entry/exit log which is located at the front gate.

Identification: All members shall have proof of membership, i.e. membership card, while on the ECSA property.

Parking: Parking is only permitted in designated parking areas.

Information: Special range closings or information can be found on the clubhouse bulletin board. This board also contains a calendar of events and a schedule of when the range is open on what days. Information on range availability and scheduling is also available on the ECSA web site: <http://www.eaglecapshooters.com/index.html>. General Range Rules are posted on all ranges and at the clubhouse.

Guests: Each member may bring up to two non-member guests. A member must accompany all non-member guests at all times and is responsible for their supervision and safety.

Alcohol and Drugs: No participant on ECSA property will be allowed to consume alcoholic beverages and/or non-prescription drugs while on ECSA property. A Certified Range Officer can deny range access to anyone in violation.

Smoking: Smoking is not allowed on the firing line or during any black powder shooting including the black powder preparation area. Smoking is not allowed in any ECSA building at anytime. Smokers must properly dispose of their waste items. Smoking may also be prohibited on ECSA property by special notice due to high fire conditions.



General Range Rules

1. An ECSA Certified Range officer **must** be present on a range anytime it is in use.
2. Eye and ear protection are required for everyone in the firing area when the range is open to firing.
3. All firearms must be unloaded except during use, with the following exceptions:
 - a. Law enforcement officers may carry loaded weapons to the extent required by written procedures of their organization; however, such firearms must be properly holstered or secured and may not be handled except in accordance with written procedures of their organization.
 - b. Concealed firearms may be carried loaded so long as they are neither visible nor apparent. Firearms carried under this provision may not be handled.
 - c. Loaded firearms may be holstered under official supervision during organized events such as Defensive Handgun, IPSC, etc.
4. Uncased firearms must always have actions open when not in use.
5. Every firearm must be pointed in a safe direction at all times.
6. No person may go forward of a firing line except during an announced Cease-Fire.
7. During a Cease-fire, no uncased firearms may be brought onto or handled on the range.
8. Everyone at the range must obey commands of the Range Safety Officer.
9. **Clean up after range use:** remove targets, pick up empty cases, trash, etc. and dispose of those items properly.
10. Be certain gates are closed and locked except during events open to non-members.
